Juvenile Justice in Pennsylvania: a Balanced and Restorative Approach

PROGRAM: Traci McPate, Assistant Juvenile Public Defender for York County, will give us an overview of Pennsylvania's juvenile delinquency system, including diversionary programs designed to address mental health, trauma, and substance abuse issues.

Ms. McPate holds a B.A. in English and Philosophy, and minors in French and Women's Studies. After graduation from the Pennsylvania State University—Dickinson School of Law with J.D. degree, she began her legal career as a prosecutor in the Child Abuse Unit of the York County District Attorney's Office. While in private practice, she served as *guardian ad litem* and legal counsel for children in the dependency system. She currently serves as legal counsel for children in the delinquency system, and is a member of the Fast Track Drug Court team.

Come and hear what our public servants in the justice system are doing to help turn youthful offenders away from a lifetime of crime and toward a more hopeful future.
