PROGRAM: Holly Morreels, full-time Title IX Coordinator at York College of Pennsylvania, will speak on workplace harassment. ("Title IX protects people from discrimination based on sex in education programs or activities that receive Federal financial assistance," according to the U.S. Department of Education, Office for Civil Rights.) She will explain what qualifies as sexual and nonsexual harassment and retaliation in the workplace and will provide what she describes as 'disturbing examples of modern-day harassment...' In addition, Holly will discuss current trends in legislation and corporate practices regarding the issue and will invite attendees to share examples of harassment they may have experienced or witnessed.

Holly received an MS in Applied Behavioral Counseling MS from Johns Hopkins University. Her recent positions included Employee Assistance Program Coordinator at WellSpan and Clinical Director of the YWCA York/Victim Assistance Center. She is Judy Morreels' daughter.

- Equal pay victory in Philadelphia lawsuit: On February 6, the United States Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit issued a PRECEDENTIAL OPINION upholding the legality of a ban on inquiries about a job applicant's prior pay to set future pay.

- 4. Paid Leave The Family Care Act
- 5. Reminder March 31 is Equal Pay Day
