PUBLIC POLICY

Vote November 3: Pennsylvania law allows vote by mail without an excuse. Here are the steps and dates for voting this fall.

Step one: Check your registration. **The website votespa.com offers information on registration and allows you to apply for an absentee or mail-in ballot online.**

October 19: Last day to register to vote or update your voter registration. Register to vote.

October 27: Last day to apply for a mail-in-ballot. However, do not wait. Do it now! Apply for a mail-in or absentee ballot.

November 2: Find your polling place. If you prefer to vote in person, be sure to check your polling place. Many were moved in the primary because of COVID-19.

November 3, 8 p.m.: Deadline to return your voted mail-in ballot. Be sure your vote is counted. Complete your ballot and send it back in the postage-paid return envelope as soon as you get it to avoid mail delays.
