PUBLIC POLICY

AAUW's Gender Policy Agenda outlines priority issues for the 2020 election season. Here is what AAUW would like to see implemented in Pennsylvania to advance gender equality in education:

- 1. DEFEND AND STRENGTHEN TITLE IX: Enact laws that align with the statutory provisions and intent of Title IX, making it clear and easy for schools to support students in accessing their education.
- 2. REDUCE STUDENT DEBT: Women hold two-thirds of the nation's \$1.46 trillion educational debt. Pass HB 244 and SB 111, the Pennsylvania Promise Act, which covers tuition and non-tuition expenses so the neediest students can succeed.
- 3. EXPAND OPPORTUNITIES FOR WOMEN AND GIRLS IN STEM: Establish grants and programs that encourage women and minorities to pursue STEM education and training.
