PUBLIC POLICY

AAUW's Gender Policy Agenda outlines priority issues for the 2020-2021 program year. Here is what AAUW would like to see nationally to advance gender equality in terms of economic security:

- 1. ENSURE EQUAL PAY FOR EQUAL WORK: Pass the Paycheck Fairness Act, the Pay Equity for All Act and the Fair Pay Act.
- 2. IMPLEMENT PAID SICK LEAVE AND PAID SICK DAYS: Pass the Family and Medical Insurance Leave (FAMILY) Act and the Healthy Families Act.
- 3. STOP HARASSMENT IN THE WORKPLACE: Pass the BE HEARD in the Workplace Act, the EMPOWER Act, and the Forced Arbitration Injustice Repeal Act.
- 4. RAISE THE MINIMUM WAGE AND ELIMINATE THE TIPPED MINIMUM WAGE: Pass the Raise Wage Act of 2019.
- 5. CLOSE THE RETIREMENT GAP: Maintain and strengthen current Social Security benefits, including full cost-of-living adjustments, guaranteed lifetime benefits, a progressive benefit formula, spousal and widow benefits and disability and survivor benefits.
- 6. PROTECT PREGNANT WORKERS: Pass the Pregnant Workers Fairness Act.
