AAUW's Gender Policy Agenda outlines priority issues for the 2020-2021 program year. Here is what AAUW would like to see nationally to advance gender equality in terms of foundational rights:

- 1. EXPAND AND PROTECT THE RIGHT TO VOTE: Pass the Voting Rights Amendment Act.
- 2. ENSURE ACCESS TO HIGH-QUALITY HEALTHCARE: Pass the Women's Health Protection Act and protect the Affordable Care Act.
- 3. RATIFY THE EQUAL RIGHTS AMENDMENT: Pass the joint resolution removing the deadline for ratification of the ERA or support the language of the ERA as a new amendment.
