EDUCATION ISSUES ACTION GROUP

Some positive results for Education in Pennsylvania

Voters in schools districts across Pennsylvania voted against extremist candidates who had run on divisive culture wars issues like book bans and anti-LGBT policies. Notably, the school boards in Central Bucks, Central York, and Pennridge were flipped by candidates campaigning to make schools more welcoming and inclusive and to reject divisive and extremist policies such as those backed by Moms for Liberty.

Thanks to everyone who voted in support of public education – there is much work to be done to ensure our lawmakers continue to support all our students!

We need to keep up the good work by urging the Basic Education Funding Commission, our legislators, and Governor Shapiro to enact fair funding for all school districts across the state.

PUBLIC POLICY

National AAUW submitted comments to the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) in support of clarifying and strengthening the proposed enforcement on Harassment in the Workplace.

National AAUW joined 17 members and partners of the Postsecondary Collaborative in a letter applauding steps by the U.S. Department of Education to empower students and families to make informed decisions by providing information about program costs and outcomes for educational institutions.

National AAUW joined over 80 organizations in opposing a Senate appropriations bill amendment that would prohibit funding for implementation of Executive Order on Promoting Access to Voting. AAUW supports strong implementation of the Executive Order to make voter registration and participation more accessible for Americans.

AAUW-PA Special Honoree – This award is given by the State Board to someone who has been active at both the State and Branch levels or has given extraordinary service to the local branch,

DIVERSITY, EQUITY, & INCLUSION COMMITTEE

As a result of our Branch's partnership with Confronting Racism Coalition (CRC), the DEI Committee was connected with Ashley Earle, Assistant Professor at York College. Ashley is the advisor to the Women in Science and Engineering Club and teaches Mechanical Engineering. Ashley approached AAUW York to see how we can partner.

On November 17, 2023 Ashley, three students, and one York College staff met at the York College campus with Carol Anderson, Carol Heintzelman, Rita Meisenhelder, and Barbara Woodmansee. One student attended NCCWSL's May 2023 conference and found it very beneficial. They discussed what AAUW offers and what the students' needs may be. We discussed the challenges the students face as young women as they enter the engineering workplace where women are in the minority. They have already experienced some challenges as they participate in their internships in area businesses.

One student expressed a concern about how she will be able to balance a career and family. We suggested that our Branch members could share their personal experiences regarding that. One student said that she does not have many opportunities to enjoy life off campus. Providing a personal place for students to meet in a relaxing atmosphere may be something else that our Branch may be able to offer to them.

Ashley is interested in York College becoming an AAUW College/University member. She was given information about that and did not feel that the membership cost of \$175 would be an obstacle to pursuing that membership.

The students and Ashley were invited to our December 12 Branch luncheon meeting. Ashley plans to attend and will let us know if any students will also be able to attend.

Discussions between our Branch and York College will continue. There is real potential for our members to become involved in this new partnership. The November 17 meeting was a good first step. Please contact Barbara or Rita if you have any questions or ideas.
