- Last Day to register to vote is October 21, 2024.
- Applications for mail-in or absentee ballots must be received at the York County Election Office by October 29, 2024, by 5 PM
- Mail-in and absentee ballots <u>must be received</u> at the York County Election Office by 8 p.m. on **November 5, 2024**
- You <u>must sign and date</u> the voter's declaration on the outer return envelope.
- ❖ If you do not complete the declaration on the return envelope, including your signature and the current date, your ballot will not be counted.

PUBLIC POLICY

Title IX Update: The new Title IX regulations that will replace the 2020 rules for sexual harassment, pregnant and parenting student rights, and protections for LBGTQ+ students have been stalled in many states across the country as Attorney Generals have filed injunctions to stop the implementation of the new rules on August 1. In over 25 states, injunctions are in place as these lawsuits move through the judicial system.

AAUW National signed onto letters opposing the stoppage of the implementation of the new rules as they directly impact the due process rights of victims on college campuses and directly affect our efforts to support all students in welcoming and inclusive schools.

In Pennsylvania, we are not part of any of these injunctions except for the Kansas ruling that permits any Moms for Liberty members to enroll their school as a participant in this ruling. The Education Law Center PA has provided guidance to schools and the ACLU has issued a fact sheet to support our advocates. Here in PA, we have the Human Relations Act that parallels the new rules and protects our LBTGQ+ students.
