PUBLIC POLICY

There is no longer a path for the ERA in the 118th Congress, but our work continues in coalition. AAUW joined the League of Women Voters and more than 140 partners in a recent letter calling on President Biden to act for publication of the ERA. The U.S. Archivist and Deputy Archivist issued a statement on the ERA ratification process. Gloria L. Blackwell, AAUW CEO, issued a response which can be found on the AAUW home page and the social media channels: Facebook, X(Twitter), Instagram. AAUW's official statement: "We are extremely frustrated at the National Archivist's refusal to publish the ERA. Her decision to side with the Trump administration and against legal scholars and the American Bar Association is reprehensible. Dr. Shogan, publish the ERA. Women around the country have waited long enough." Gloria L. Blackwell, Chief Executive Officer.
