The Municipal Election is on November 4, 2025. The polls are open from 7AM to 8 PM.

- Last Day to register to vote is October 20, 2025.
- Applications for mail-in or absentee ballots must be received at the York County Election Office by October 28, 2025, by 5 PM.
- Mail-in and absentee ballots must be received at the York County Election Office by 8 PM on November 4, 2025.
- You must sign and date the voter's declaration on the outer return envelope. If you do not complete the declaration on the return envelope of your mail-in or absentee ballot, including your signature and the current date, your ballot will not be counted.

PUBLIC POLICY

AAUW is joining our partners from the Campaign for Women's Health in hosting an Advocacy Day in Harrisburg on November 18. The goals of this day will be: (1) Make it clear what our legislative priorities are in the House and Senate; (2) Show the force of our campaign through the collaboration of our partners and their supporters showing up in the Capitol; (3) Host a "rage room" where supporters can directly advocate for your legislative priorities; (4) Legislative meetings connecting organization leaders and advocates with elected officials. The Campaign for Women's Health will provide all the messaging and support you will need in meetings with our lawmakers, as well as having a listing of bills we are endorsing, materials to drop off at offices, and signs to hold for any press events. We hope to schedule at least one opportunity on the steps of the Capitol to share our stories and demands for action with invitations to our state leaders to join us. The registration link has not been released yet, but once it is available, it will be shared with all branches.
